

Kindergarten Registration Week - October 13-16, 2015

Registration for children entering Kindergarten in September 2016 will be held from October 13th-16th at your community school.

Parents are reminded that Kindergarten attendance in 2016-2017 is compulsory for children born in 2011, except if a child is born between September $1_{\rm st}$ and December $31_{\rm st}$ of that year. These children have the option of starting Kindergarten the following year.

If you have a child entering Kindergarten next year, visit the main office between 8:30 am-3:00 pm to have him or her registered.

<u>Proof of immunization, Birth certificate and Medicare cards</u> <u>are required at the time of registration.</u>

It is important that your child be registered at this time in order to receive information needed for pre-school screening and successful transition into school for September 2016.


